TrashTech: A Replicative Solid Waste Management Model



CYDA launched 'TrashTech' one of the replicative solid waste management models at Visarwadi village. Our initiative has created impact by practicing proper waste management systems - collecting waste from source & processing solid waste management by scientific treatments. TrashTech manages SW in rural areas with its

own system. This system has affordable, sustainable, environment friendly, long-term, cost-effective, efficient solutions for all the solid waste generated in Visarwadi GP.

The unique values of our solution are Innovation, Integrity, Education and training, Efficiency, Economic Prudence, Resourcefulness, integrated Services, Stakeholder/Community Partnerships & Implementing waste reduction, recycling and environmental education & cost-effective resources and services with sound environmental policies and practices.

CYDA also initiated project - **Making Waste free Slums** through Sustainable Solid Waste Management for protecting environment & promoting livelihood opportunities in Pimpri Chinchwad, Pune. We have adopted decentralized approach, where in a group of women from weaker sections collectively come together as key implementing agents of the model.

a) Personal Hygiene Kit at Gurukul Ashramshala, Nagpur



CYDA & Persistent Foundation joined hands to support the students, under the project **Promoting a Healthy Environment in schools of Nagpur city.**i)To enhance the hygienic status among school students & bring positive behavioural changes, hygiene kits (Nail Cutter, Comb, Handwash pouch, bucket & Medicare hair oil) have been distributed to **375 students.**

b) Educational materials in 03 schools of Nagpur

ii) CYDA conducted trainings with school children under WASH component. This helped the students develop an interest in washing their hands-on critical times, importance of drinking clean and safe water as well as the importance of using toilets to maintain personal hygiene in their daily life. Each school have been provided educational kit which includes - Six box Puzzle (Front Back), Innovative games - Snake & Ladder; Magnetic Dart Game.

One day, while sitting in a local tea shop, witnessed **WASH**

MITRA (One Stop Solution) advertisement on a social media platform. He knew that there were plenty of training centres in his area, but none of them were offering multi skilled, small-batch, residential training free of cost. He joined the training and learnt plumbing, electrician, mason, carpenter, water filter and solar installation skills. He spent countless hours to visit ZP Schools, GP offices, Healthcare facilities & nearby institutions to search scope for the operation and maintenance works. He also knew that marketing is necessary to create demand for WASH MITRA. Sanjay started working as WASH MITRA & realized O&M of schools have great scope of

Expansion of Community Resource Centre



CYDA initiated CRC at Makadwadi, Sinnar, where 25 youth from the neighbouring two vicinities of urban slum communities were enrolled in the centre. The center has been instrumental in providing remedial education, ducational support & providing a safe platform for young people to

discuss on topics - gender, reproductive health and mental health. Young women are promoted with Non-Traditional Livelihood skills and adolescent girls with STEM Education in ZP schools. These encourages them to take livelihood opportunities which break the gender stereotypes.

Now, he has become very famous and trustworthy among people and getting plenty of work orders from his village and surrounding areas as well. He is planning to open a small shop in his area. At times he hires other young people for his assistance. He also donated a portion of his profits to local schools, giving back to the community that had supported him from the beginning. Days later, he also got work orders from health facilities. Sanjay has an entrepreneurial spirit, always dreaming up of new ideas and finding ways to grow and develop his business. He thanked CYDA for WASH MITRA' training which provided tool kit and mentoring support to make him young entrepreneur and gain respect and new identity for his work. He acknowledged that he is gaining a hike in his monthly payments after the training. Earlier he used to work for Rs.3350/- per month and now he is earning approximately Rs.13840/- per month.
